If you are applying for a position that requires an interview (PALS 1, PALS 2, A-Team, Adult Participant or Volunteer Staff), you will receive information on how to schedule your interview after your completed application packet and tuition have been received.

Again, ITI is working to align more directly with the DHS Office of Prevention Services Work Plan guidelines and outlook by including more direct training for ITI attendees on impacting public policy, understanding advocacy and creating community change. This move should enable more volunteers and youth to participate in the Institute. ITI hopes to continue to be the training ground for youth impactors and advocates statewide and will continue to offer opportunities for youth to become involved in public policy change and activism through educational sessions and Community Action Teams planning and implementation. Hello Prevention Friends,

Many people have asked me how I got involved with Operation Snowball and why I continue to be so involved in Operation Snowball. The simple answer is that Operation Snowball helped shape me into the person I am today. Snowball gave me a passion for life and for prevention. It also gave me the belief that I can, and do, have an impact on others. Through Operation Snowball I gained leadership skills that have advanced me as an individual and helped me to accomplish my dreams. I was extremely fortunate to begin my involvement with Operation Snowflake in 7th grade. With each subsequent year, I was given different opportunities to advance my leadership skills

As the Substance Abuse Prevention Coordinator at Adlai E. Stevenson High School, I am part of a sound program providing youth with new leadership development opportunities. These opportunities continue to grow as our youth get older. This past weekend, I participated in one of two annual retreats hosted by our chapter. As I watched the process unfold during the two and a half days at Camp MacLean in Burlington, WI, I was reminded of what keeps me involved in Operation Snowball programs. There are multiple levels of advanced leadership training including students who have never attended Snowball, to graduates of the program who are back to share their experiences. In addition to our junior and senior teen staff training for 40+ hours before EACH weekend retreat, second time participants are cultivated into future teen staff by participating in a Sophomore Leadership Program (SLP). This program is designed to give them insight into what being a teen staff member is all about. It also gives them a chance to talk in a more focused way about what leadership means. They also participate in high ropes initiatives lead by two seasoned teen staffers and an experienced adult staff member.

We routinely have over 45 teens apply to be staff. Snowball II (SB2) was created to keep those juniors not selected to be staff involved in the program and advancing their skills. This program focuses on their senior year as teen staff as well and "life after high school." We have Teen Directors for each event, who are seasoned staff members. All seniors with the exception of one junior, gets to observe and lead with these graduating seniors. This is done at the March event and ultimately provides leadership for the new senior group that will be directing the December and March events the following year. Teen Directors begin their work on the year's events the summer before. These students also belong to a small group that is designed to give them additional training before the weekend in addition to time during the weekend for processing events. Another program that the Stevenson chapter has in place is an opportunity for past teen directors to return to Snowball. These young adults speak to Snowball attendees about their experiences in Snowball. This is done during the opening large group session. They also shadow an adult co-facilitator to learn the new role they will fill in the future as adult staff. All of the above programs are held concurrently. Through the leveled leadership development system we have watched our program become something that regenerates itself time and time again. We never have a problem when it comes to recruiting teen and adult staff.

This is just one example of how our chapter mentors the youth within our program. What does your chapter do? Please write to us and share your ideas and innovative models!

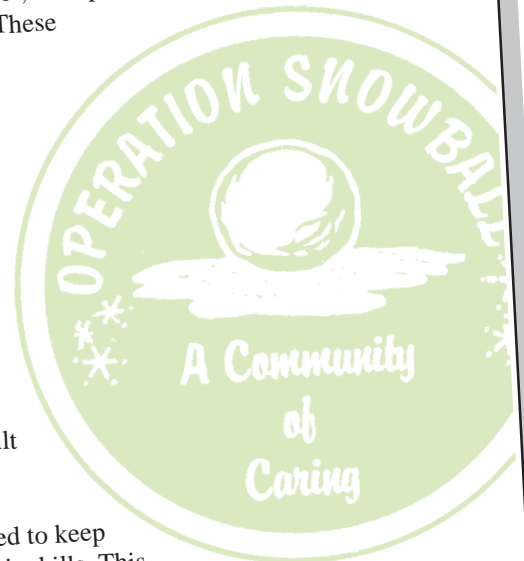

The theme for the weekend was “Unleash The Magic In You.” Students listened to guest speakers, participated in discussion groups, and did team building exercises.

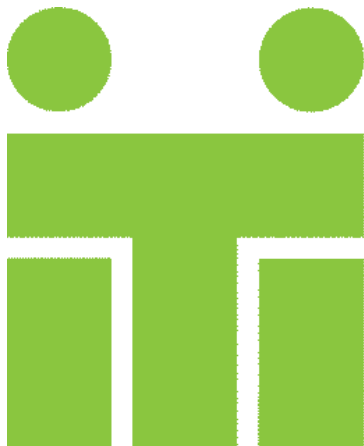
All volunteer staff and participants who attended MLI are invited to attend the MLI reunion which will be held on September 29, 2007. More information about this event will be provided at a later date.

In Remembrance

It is with great sadness that we remember our friend and colleague Joe Anna Sullivan, who passed away suddenly on January 12, 2007.

Joe Anna was passionate about improving conditions for children and families, and she was truly “tri-lingual” in her understanding of the substance abuse treatment, child welfare and family court systems that collaborate to achieve these improvements. She was a state policy maker and administrator in both the child welfare and substance abuse fields, and she had an exceptional talent in navigating the political situations.

Over the course of her career, she was the executive director of a community-based substance abuse prevention and treatment program; Cook County regional manager of the Illinois Department of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse; and deputy director of the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services, where she led the effort to create the largest substance abuse Title IV-E Waiver Demonstration in the nation, ensuring that parents with substance abuse disorders in Cook County received timely access to care.

In her most recent position as Chief Executive Officer of the Illinois Alcoholism and Drug Dependence Association (IADDA), she used her outstanding leadership and advocacy skills to strengthen the service system in Illinois.

The children and families of Illinois and of our nation have benefited greatly from Joe Anna’s passion and dedication. Her accomplishments are an inspiration to those who continue in this crucially important work.

International Snowball

Labas Visiems (Hello All)

Great news from Lithuania! Our Snowball group in the village of Vydmantai has been invited to Turkey to participate in a European prevention conference this May. Seven countries will be represented at the meeting. There will be five teens and one adult in attendance presenting Snowball as the primary prevention program in Lithuania, a designation bestowed upon the program last year by the Lithuanian Ministry of Education.

Vydmantai is a very small village near the Baltic Sea. The school is outstanding and has a wonderful spirit. The director (principal) is a great supporter of the Snowball program and provides his staff with support, both financial and morale. Several classrooms have stadium seating and all classrooms have a computer and flat screen television. The school had a prevention program for over five years, and joined the Snowball family about a year and a half ago. They have established a strong Snowball program with able and enthusiastic teens and adults.

We visited Vydmantai on “Pancake” day, which we know as Mardi Gras, the day before the beginning of Lent. A group of teens dressed in costumes went to each classroom offering wishes for an end to winter. There was a bonfire in the schoolyard with a battle held between “spring and winter.”

We think winter won because the rest of the week the temperature dropped to more than twenty below zero. Our group; consisting of Carmen Samples, Nan Zion, Darrin Ingram, Justin Petitt, Dan Kirkpatrick, and Jack Irwin, learned about Vydmantai's landmark trip to Turkey while making an extensive trip through Lithuania to visit the majority of our Snowball programs



When Pat Gerber and Jack Irwin visited some of the new Snowball groups in Lithuania last spring, it became obvious that it was important to

visit the individual programs to show each group how important they are. As a result, the six of us on the February-March trip presented over 26 workshops for 13 of our Snowball groups in small villages and big cities. We did presentations for teens, parents, and teachers. In many cases, the schools provided us with transportation and always had a wonderful meal for us. The remainder of our travel around the country was by public busses; Lithuania has a very efficient nationwide public transit system. In the span of 15 days we met the groups from 13 cities: Palanga, Vydmantai,

Kretinga, Klaipeda, Skaistgirys, Pavalys, Panevezys, Vilnius, Zelva, Paluknas, Marijampole, Moletai, and Sirvintos. The trip was exhausting but gratifying!

We were fortunate to be able to attend the 10th anniversary of the Snowball program in Vilnius and present the leadership a certificate from Operation Snowball, Inc. Jack and one young adult were the only ones there who had attended the very first Vilnius Snowball back in 1997.

In the remaining days of our trip we presented a three-day conference on staff training for 28 Snowball leaders, teens and adults in a small central Lithuanian resort town called Birstonas. The Vilnius chapter financed the conference with a portion of the funds from a substantial grant they received in 2006. From participant feedback, the conference was a success. Our goal was to provide a model for staff training.

Plans are being made to return to Lithuania this summer to sponsor a Snowball and a community training in the small village of Paluknas. Anyone interested in helping with this project should contact Jack Irwin at johntirwin@comcast.net.
